



Glue Removal Instructions:

If on Skin, Hair or Fur:

- A. First, attempt to remove the glue by using soap and water. If soap and water does not work, please move onto the steps below.
- B. Apply drug store mineral oil (Do not use mineral oil from a hardware store), cooking oils or petroleum jelly to the affected area(s) and gently work it in where possible.
- C. Allow to absorb into the surface of the glue product for at least 30 minutes; an hour is strongly suggested.
- D. For animals, a collar to prevent licking of the affected area may be needed; licking the area may result in severe gastro-intestinal distress.
- E. Very slowly peel away glue from the skin. Do not use a lot of force to attempt the removal.
- F. Repeat if needed. This may take two or three periods.
- G. If 3 cycles of treatment have failed to remove the product, seek medical or veterinary advice.
- H. If hair or fur is involved, shaving of the affected area may be required to remove the product.
- I. After product is removed, wash the affected area thoroughly with soap and water.
- J. If skin irritation continues or if a rash occurs, seek medical advice. For mild irritation, an emollient lotion may be of benefit. Consult with medical personnel.
